Now it is your turn to learn an arrangement of a piece by Joplin! You will be practicing another of his famous ragtime pieces, *The Entertainer*.

### Complete the following theory tasks as you practice the piece this week:

- 1. Circle and identify the time signature and key signature of this piece.
- 2. This piece contains each of the primary chords: I, IV, and V7. Find and label each of these chords in the music. (Hint: these chords are broken!)
- 3. Write in the counts for the right hand for the first two lines of this piece.
- 4. Tap the rhythm for both hands for line 2 of this piece (m. 5-7).
- 5. Circle the repeat signs in this piece.
